Your Board has asked me for an opinion as to whether or not you can expend money from the County Treasury for the closing in of an open water course along an alley within the corporate limits of the City of Alliance.

I have investigated the law carefully and in my opinion you have no authority to expend the total cost or a part of the cost of making such improvement. There is no statutory authority for your doing so that I have been able to find.

The City of Alliance has such authority and therefore, in my judgement, the expense of the improvement must be born by the City of Alliance.
