

NOVEMBER 16th, 1914.

Council met in regular session, pursuant to adjournment with President Reeves in the chair.

The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Barnard, Binkley, Cathon, Grubb, Heidman, Knowles, Ryan. Present 7, Absent 0. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following petition was presented to Council, and read:

We hereby petition your Honorable Body to vacate that portion of the alley leading east from Park Avenue and lying immediately between Lot #89 and #364 and that portion of the alley running between Park Avenue and Walnut Avenue extending north from the alley noted above, and to C. & P. R.R., all of which portion of alley lies directly in the rear of lot #89. We are the owners of the adjacent lots and property to these two portions of alleys and the only persons directly interested in them. These portions of alleys are of no value to the City or to any of its inhabitants, other than ourselves and for these and various other reasons we hereby pray for the vacation thereof.

Mr. Barnard: - To issue bonds for the purpose of enlarging and improving the storm sewer system of the City of Alliance; was read the first time. Referred to the Committee on Finance.

Resolution No. 1854.

Mr. Heidman: - To issue a certificate of indebtedness of the City of Alliance, to provide for funds for the expenses of the Department of Public Safety; was read the first time. Referred to the Committee on Finance.

Ordinance No. 1851.

Mr. Knowles: - To issue bonds for the purpose of purchasing a police patrol ambulance automobile for the City of Alliance; was read the first time. Referred to the Committee on Finance and Fire and Patrol.

Ordinance No. 1850.

Mr. Ryan: - To issue bonds for the purpose of constructing sub-fire station No. 4; was read the first time. Referred to the Finance Committee.
