Section 1. Be it ordained & enacted by the council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that the improvement of said Arch street from Main street in Mt. Union Ward north to Summit street, be proceeded within accordance with the resolution passed the 1st day of October, 1888, by cutting filings, putting to the grade that portion of Arch street between said points.

Section 2. Be it ordained & enacted by the council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that the Mayor & Clerk of said city be & they are hereby authorized & instructed to issue the bonds of said city amounting in the aggregate (\$7,760.00) to seventeen thousand, seven hundred & sixty dollars for the purpose of extending the time of the payment of the bonded debt of said city falling due February 1st, 1889.

An Ordinance.

To authorize the Mayor ^{and} Clerk to issue the bonds of the City of Alliance, Ohio for the sum of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) for the purpose of paying the present floating debt of said city, ^{and} to levy a tax for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of the same.

Whereas, The General Assembly of the State of Ohio, did, by an act entitled "An act to authorize the City of Alliance, Stark county, O., to borrow money ^{and} issue bonds therefore to pay the outstanding indebtedness of the city" passed February 12, 1889 authorize ^{and} empower the Council of the city of Alliance, Stark county, Ohio to borrow money and issue the bonds of said city in any sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually for the purpose of paying the present floating debt of said city, consisting of sundry ^{orders} made and claims created by Council from time to time in the past against its treasury in excess of the money on hand at the time of their several issues; and

Whereas, By the act aforesaid, the said City Council is further authorized to levy a tax on all the taxable property in said city not exceeding one mill on each dollar in any one year, in addition to the taxes now authorized by law, which levy shall be placed on the duplicate by the Auditor of said county, and collected as other taxes, for the purpose of paying said bonds ^{and} the interest thereon, as the same may become due; no therefore,

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that the Mayor ^{and} Clerk of said city be and they are hereby authorized ^{and} directed to issue the bonds of said city amounting in the aggregate to the sum of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14,000) for the purpose of paying the present floating debt of said city, consisting of sundry orders made and claims created by Council from time to time in the past against its treasury in excess of the money on hand at the time of their several issues.

Section 2. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually, principal and interest payable when due at the office of city treasurer. They shall have interest coupons attached, and each bond ^{and} coupon shall be authenticated by the signatures of the Mayor and Clerk of said city, and bear on their face the imprint of the seal of said city. They shall be denominated "Floating Debt Bonds," and shall each indicate on its face the special statute ^{and} ordinance in pursuance of which they are issued. They shall be issued in suitable denominations of not less than one hundred dollars, and may be renewable from time to time within a term not exceeding fifteen years from the date of issue. Said bonds shall be sold according to law at not less than their par value. Provided that one thousand dollars of the aggregate amount of bonds so issued shall be due ^{and} payable in two years from the date of issue; one thousand dollars of the aggregate amount of the bonds so issued shall be due ^{and} payable in ^{three} years from the date of issue; one thousand dollars of the aggregate amount of the bonds so issued shall be due ^{and} payable in four years from date of issue, and eleven thousand dollars.

of the aggregate amount of the bonds so issued shall be, due ^{and} payable in five years from the date of issue.

Section 3. That for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the same may become due, a tax is hereby levied on all taxable property in said city, except M. Union ward, not exceeding one mill on each dollar in any one year, in addition to the taxes now authorized by law, which levy the clerk is hereby directed to certify the Auditor of Stark County, to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes; and if in any year the amount thus raised exceeds the amount of the bonds and interest due in that year, such balance shall be carried to the sinking fund of said city, to apply on the general bonded debt and interest of the same.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage ^{and} due publication.

An Ordinance

To amend the grade on First Street

Be it Ordained and Enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance. That an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish a grade on First Street between Sister Avenue and State Street" passed October 22, 1878 be amended to read as follows:

Beginning at the center of Sister Avenue at an elevation of (Seventy four) (74) feet thence to the center of Patterson Street to an elevation of Seventy eight and fifty hundredths (78.50) feet. Thence to the north rail of the P.D.W. & C R. y to an elevation of eighty two and eighty hundredths (82.80) feet Thence to the center of Prospect Street to an elevation of Eighty two and eighty hundredths (82.80) feet thence to the north side of Main Street to an elevation of ninety three (93) feet thence to the south side of Main Street to an elevation of ninety four (94) feet thence to the center of Market Street to an elevation of one hundred and four and sixty four (104.64) hundredths feet thence to the center of Columbia Street to an elevation of one hundred and seventeen and fifty hundredths (117.50) feet. These elevations apply to the center line of the street and refer to the City Bench Mark of Alliance. The tops of the curbs on each side to be of the same elevations as the center of the street except between the centers of Market and High Streets where the east curb shall be three (3) inches higher and the west curb three (3) inches lower said difference to run out at the first-grade point north of Market Street and south of High Street

A Resolution declaring it necessary to improve Arch Street from Summit Street South to Widener Street

Resolved that in the opinion of two thirds of the Members elected to the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio it is necessary to improve Arch Street from Summit Street South to Widener Street by grading the same paving the road bed with fire brick, block or other material deemed proper for a distance of not more than twenty eight feet (28) in width setting curb and gutter stones and constructing the necessary drains, Culverts and crosswalks (Such improvement being recommended by the Street Committee of Council) in accordance with specifications on file with said Street Committee. The expense of said improvement to be assessed per foot front upon the property abutting thereon according to the law and ordinances on the subject of assessments. The assessments therefor to be payable in five (5) annual installments if deferred and the same collected according to law and the assessing ordinance hereafter to be passed

Bonds may be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments unless the property owners pay their assessments before the same are issued and within the time prescribed in said assessing ordinance and the Clerk is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the Corporation for a period of two consecutive weeks.
