

MONDAY, APRIL 5th, 1915.

The Mayor called the attention of Council to the offer of the Daughters of Veterans to furnish a flag for the new City Hall Building.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by Barnard, the offer of the Daughters of Veterans was accepted and a vote of thanks extended to said organization for offering to place a flag on the new City Hall.

Cathon moved, seconded by Heidman, that the City Solicitor be requested to prepare an ordinance regulating the placing of the wires of the Ohio Telephone Company underground on certain streets and alleys in the City of Alliance, which motion was agreed to.

On motion of Knowles, seconded by Ryan, Council adjourned.
