ORDINANCE NO. 1922.

Heidman inquired as to whether the Ordinance requiring all poles in the streets to be painted was passed.

The records show that the Ordinance was referred to the Committee, and the Committee had not yet reported on same.

On motion of Ryan, seconded by Barnard, the City Solicitor was requested to prepare an ordinance for the vacation of an alley adjacent to the Lincoln Avenue School Building.

On motion of Heidman, seconded by Cathon, the Light Committee was authorized to employ an Electrical Engineer, the sum not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).
