The following communication was received and read:

Alliance, Ohio, June 28, 1915.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance.

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned property owners of four lots on the north side of E. Cambridge St. just east of Union Avenue are badly annoyed by water over-running all our lots. To do away with its unhealthy condition, we earnestly desire your Co-operation to remedy the evil. In order that we may more quickly understand each other, we herewith offer the following solutions:

First - For the sum of Two Hundred and Seventy Dollars we will agree to furnish and lay in a workman-like manner sufficient 36 inch B Grade Sewer pipe to reach across the four lots in question commencing at a point opposite a certain culvert going under the N.Y.C.R.R. and thirty feet west of centerline of said R.R. and going in a nearly west line across aforesaid lots to a point where the north and south alley joins Cambridge Street.

Second - On consideration of the City furnishing sufficient sewer pipe to do the work F.O.B.R.R. siding we will agree to haul same to place needed, dig ditch and place pipe therein cutting through the embankment on Cambridge placing pipe and filling up excavation again. All work to be done under the supervision of City Engineer.

Note this second proposition will save the City not less than two Hundred Dollars and give same results as first offer.

Or we will consider favorably counter proposals from your Honorable Body.
