The following communication was received and on motion referred to the Committee on Grades, Director of Public Service and the City Solicitor.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance,
Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:

The City some time ago established a grade on Simpson St., west of Union Ave., and the land on the north side of said street is owned by the undersigned, while the land on the south side of the street is owned by the Stark Electric Railway Company.

We are now grading the north one-half of Simpson St., and the south half therefore is not being graded at all. By grading the north side of the street to the established grade, it leaves the south side at portions high and in other parts low, so that the high parts will be dangerous to travel and the low parts will eventually become mud holes and also dangerous.

We are calling your attention to this fact at this time so that your body may take such action as to the improvement by grading of the south side of the street as you may deem fit and also that you may prevent any future trouble by reason of the condition of said street, and the probability of accidents or injury.

We respectfully ask that your honorable body take immediate action upon this matter so the street may be completed without further delay.


