

An Ordinance to amend the grade on North Union Ave

Sec 1

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that an Ordinance establishing a grade on North Union Avenue passed August 18th 1879 be amended to read as follows.

Beginning with the established grade on the north side of Main Street at an elevation of one hundred and seven and one tenth (107.1) feet thence to the south curb of Prospect Street to an elevation of ninety two and six tenths (92.6) feet thence to the north curb of prospect street to an elevation of ninety one and six tenths (91.6) feet

thence to the south side of the P. F. W. & C. R.R. to an elevation of eighty (80) feet thence to the north side of the P. F. W. & C. R.R. to an elevation of seventy nine (79) feet thence to the center of an alley to an elevation of seventy seven and fifty seven hundredths (77.57) feet thence to the south curb of Ely Street to an elevation of seventy nine and twenty five hundredths feet (79.25)

thence to the north curb of Ely Street to an elevation of seventy nine and twenty five hundredths (79.25) feet thence to the south curb of Washington Street to an elevation of seventy one and fifty seven (71.57) hundredths feet. thence to the north curb of Washington Street to an elevation of seventy one and seventeen hundredths (71.17) feet

thence to the south curb of Wayne Street to an elevation of sixty five and seven and five tenths (67.5) feet thence to the north curb of Wayne Street to an elevation of sixty seven and one tenth (67.1) feet thence to the south curb of Keystone Street to an elevation of sixty three and four hundredths (63.04) thence to the north curb of Keystone Street to an elevation of sixty two and sixty four hundredths feet (62.64) thence to the south curb of Perry Street to an elevation of fifty eight and fifty eight hundredths (58.58) feet thence over the C & P R.R. to the south

curb of Vine street to an elevation of fifty six and eleven hundredths, (56.11) feet thence to the north curb of Vine Street to an elevation of Fifty five and Seventy one hundredths feet (55.71) thence to the north line of the corporation to an elevation of forty four and Ninety one (44.91) hundredths feet.

Sec II These elevations to apply to the center of the street. The top of the curbs on each side to be of the same elevation as the center except in crossing the right of way of the P.F.W. & C.R.R. The sidewalks on each side may be two (2) feet above the center of the street this difference to run out at the first grade point on each side beyond said right of way.

Sec III All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed This ordinance to take effect and be in force in ten days after its passage and Publication Passed January 5th 1891.

An Ordinance To authorize the issue of the bonds of the city in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment on Patterson street from C. & P. R. R. to east corporation line"

Sec I

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that to provide a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of improving Patterson street from the C. & P. R. R. to the east corporation line and in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment therefor the Mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance Ohio for the sum of six thousand (6000) dollars in ten distinct series numbered falling due and for the amounts as follows to wit: First series for (\$600⁰⁰) falling due one year from date of issue
 Second series for (\$600⁰⁰) falling due two years from date of issue
 Third " " (\$600⁰⁰) " " three " " " " " "
 Fourth " " (\$600⁰⁰) " " four " " " " " "
 Fifth " " (\$600⁰⁰) " " five " " " " " "

With interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semiannually. interest and principal payable when due at the office of the city treasurer. Said bonds shall bear date of April 1st 1891 and shall be numbered consecutively as the city clerk may determine. Said bonds shall be designated on their face "Patterson Street improvement Bonds" shall each show on its face the Statute and Ordinance in pursuance of which it is issued. Shall each be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the city clerk shall each bear on its face the impress of the city seal. and shall be sold by said Mayor and Clerk under direction of the finance committee of council according to law for not less than their par value. The several installments of interest shall be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds. That said bonds shall be issued in denominations of ten bonds of six hundred (600) dollars each.

That the proceeds derived from the sale of said Bonds shall be applied to the cost and expense of improving Patterson Street and to no other purpose whatsoever. Provided that if before the sale of said bonds any of the owners of property between the points mentioned on said Patterson Street shall pay the whole of said ten installments in cash less the interest on the deferred installments, or in other words pay ten times the amount assessed for the year 1891. The amount so paid in cash shall be applied to the amount due the contractor and the amount of the bonds to be issued in the first series or succeeding series in their order shall be reduced by deducting the amount so paid in cash from the total amount of the first series or succeeding series in their order, and the bonds issued shall be to provide a fund for the unpaid remainder.

Sec II That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the treasury of the city to the credit of the Patterson Street improvement fund and that the said annual assessments and all portions thereof shall be paid into the sinking fund when collected and shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec III That an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to authorize the issue of the bonds of the city in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment on Patterson Street from the C.V.P.R.R to the east corporation line", passed October 6th 1890 and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec 4 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and due publication.

Sec I Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that to provide a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of improving North Webb Street from the P. F. W. & Co R.R. to the north line of the corporation and in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment therefor the Mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance Ohio for the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7500⁰⁰) in five distinct series, numbered, falling due and for the amounts as follows To wit:

Sec I Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that to provide a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of improving Seneca Street from Main Street to the south side of Summit Street and in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment therefor the Mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance Ohio for the sum of Fourteen Thousand dollars (\$14000⁰⁰) in ten distinct series, numbered, falling due and for the amounts as follows to wit:

The amount so paid in cash shall be applied to the amount due the contractor and the amount of the bonds to be issued in the first series or succeeding series in their order shall be reduced by deducting the amount so paid in cash from the total amount of said first series or succeeding series in their order and the bonds issued shall be to provide a fund for the unpaid remainder

An Ordinance to improve Oxford Street from Arch Street to Union Avenue

Sec I Be it ordained by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio that the improvement of Oxford Street from Arch Street to Union Avenue be proceeded with in accordance with the resolution ~~passed~~ to improve the same adopted the 3^d day of March 1890. by grading the same and macadamizing the road bed with furnace slag to a width of not less than twenty eight feet. and constructing the necessary culverts and drains.

Sec II That the cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed upon the lots and lands abutting thereon per foot front according to the laws of assessments. The assessments therefor to be paid in five annual installments if deferred and the same collected as provided by law and the assessing ordinance hereafter to be passed. Bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessments unless the property owners pay their assessments before the same are due and within the time prescribed in said assessing Ordinance

Whereas the General assembly of the State of Ohio did by an act entitled "An act to authorize the city of Alliance Ohio to borrow money and issue bonds therefor to pay the outstanding indebtedness of said city" passed Feb 12. 1889. authorize and empower the Council of the city of Alliance Stark County Ohio to borrow money and issue Bonds of said city in any sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars (\$15000⁰⁰) and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum payable semiannually for the purpose of paying the then present floating debt of said city consisting of sundry orders made and claims created by Council from time to time in the past against its Treasury in excess of the money on hand at the time of their several issues, and

Whereas by the act aforesaid the said city Council is further authorized to levy a tax on all the taxable property in said city not exceeding one mill on each dollar in any one year in addition to the taxes now authorized by law, which levy shall be placed on the tax duplicate by the Auditor of said County, and collected as other taxes, for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the same may become due, and

Whereas the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio did by an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to authorize the Mayor and Clerk to issue the bonds of the city of Alliance Ohio for the sum of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14000⁰⁰) for the purpose of paying the floating debt of said city and levy a tax for the principal and interest of the same" passed March 18. 1889. authorize the issue of fourteen thousand dollars (\$14000⁰⁰) of bonds in pursuance of the above described authority and the said

An Ordinance.

To fix the Salary and prescribe the Duties of the city clerk

- Sec 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio That the Salary of the city clerk shall be sixty dollars per month to be paid monthly out of the city Treasury.
- Sec II. The City Clerk shall attend all meetings of the council and make a fair and accurate record of its proceedings and of all by-laws, resolutions and ordinances passed by the council and perform such other duties as are at present or may be imposed by the statutes of Ohio or required of him from time to time by the city council. He shall be required to devote his whole time and attention to the duties of his office and the city shall furnish him with a suitable place in which to keep his books and papers and to transact the business relating to his official position.
- Sec III. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the expiration of the term for which the present incumbent was elected.

An Ordinance to amend section VIII of an Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to provide for the granting of Licenses

Sec 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the council of the city of Alliance Ohio. ^{Section VIII of} That an Ordinance entitled An Ordinance to provide for the granting of Licenses passed July 7th 1890 be amended to read as follows:

Each Keeper of a pawnbroker's office shall pay a license of from \$5⁰⁰ to \$10⁰⁰ per day or \$5⁰⁰ per year if he prefers.

Each Hawker shall pay from \$2⁰⁰ to \$10⁰⁰ per day. The owner of or manager of each circus or Menagerie shall pay not less than \$25⁰⁰ nor more than \$100⁰⁰ per day. The owner or manager of each side ~~side~~ show or concert or exhibitions of monsters or freaks of nature shall pay not less than \$1⁰⁰ per day nor more than \$5⁰⁰ per day.

Each owner or manager of any Opera house Theatre or Skating Rink. Shall pay license of \$50⁰⁰ per year. Each huckster in the public streets shall at his option pay a license of \$50⁰⁰ per year or from 50 cents to one dollar per day, to be fixed by the Mayor. The proprietor of each shooting gallery swing flying horse or run around striking machine or other device of amusement operated for pay shall pay from \$2⁰⁰ to \$5⁰⁰ per day any person who shall sell or cause to be sold at auction any goods wares or merchandise medicine or other articles imported into this city to be sold shall pay a license of not less than \$5⁰⁰ nor more than \$25⁰⁰ per day. That every transient dealer or person or persons who open in this city a store or place for the temporary sale of goods wares or merchandise shall pay a license of from \$1⁰⁰ to \$5⁰⁰ per day. but this clause shall not apply to persons selling by sample only nor to any agricultural article or products offered or exposed for sale by the producer.

Sec II This Ordinance shall take and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and publication.

Said Bonds shall be designated "Sidewalk Bonds" and shall bear date of July 20th 1891, shall each show on its face the statute and ordinance in pursuance of which it is issued and shall be issued in denominations of two hundred (200) dollars each, and shall become due and payable in two years from date of issue with interest at a rate not to exceed six per cent per annum payable semi-annually. Interest and principal payable when due at the office of the city treasurer. Said bonds shall have interest coupons attached. Shall each be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk and shall each bear on its face the impress of the city seal.

Sec III. That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed to the credit of the sidewalk fund, to be used for the purpose of constructing sidewalks and upon the collection of the levy in anticipation of which said bonds are issued the same shall be paid into the sinking fund and applied to the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and to no other purpose whatsoever.

An Ordinance to amend section "8" of an Ordinance Entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the granting of licenses."

Section 1.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that Section 8 of an Ordinance Entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the granting of licenses, passed July 7th 1890 be amended to read as follows:

(Section 8)

Each keeper of a pawnbroker's office shall pay a license of from \$5.00 to \$10.00 per day or \$50.00 per year if he prefers.

Each hawker shall pay from \$2.00 to \$10.00 per day. The owner of or manager of each circus or menagerie shall pay not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 per day.

The owner of or manager of each side show or concert or exhibition of monsters or freaks of nature shall pay not less than \$1.00 per day nor more than \$5.00 per day. Each

owner or manager of any opera house, theater, or skating rink, shall pay a license of \$50.00 per year, each huckster in the public streets shall at his option pay a license of \$50.00 per year or from (50 cents) fifty cents to (\$1.00) one dollar per day to be fixed by the Mayor.

The proprietor of each shooting gallery, swing, flying horse, or run around, striking machine or other device of amusement operated for pay shall pay from \$2.00 to \$5.00 per day. Any person or persons who shall sell or cause to be sold at auction

any goods, wares, merchandise, medicine or other articles imported into this City to be sold, shall pay a license of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25.00 per day

that every transient dealer or person or persons who open in the City a store or place for the temporary sale of goods, wares, or merchandise shall pay a

license of from \$1.00 to \$5.00 per day, but this clause shall not apply to persons selling by sample only, nor to any agricultural article or product offered or

exposed for sale by the producer.

Section 2.

This ordinance shall take and be in force when ten days shall have elapsed after its passage and publication.
