Council met in regular session with President Reeves in the chair.

On motion of Barnard, members Knowles and Cathon were excused from attendance at this session.

Mr. Heidman called attention to the improvement of South Union Avenue, and in order to preserve the thoroughfare, he spoke of regulating the heavy traffic which the street would be subject to the use of.

Heidman moved, seconded by Barnard, that the City Solicitor and the City Engineer be instructed to frame an ordinance to regulate the width of tires for various sized loads that are drawn over improved streets. The motion was agreed to.

City Solicitor Morris called Council's attention to the bad condition of the streets in the different parts of the City, and stated that some action should be taken to remedy this bad condition.

On motion, the Service Director was instructed to have the City Engineer examine sidewalks which should be repaired, and lots minus sidewalks, and report to Council at the next meeting.

Mr. Binkley called up the matter of sidewalks on South Street, neither side of that street having any proper ways from Avalon to Freedom, and the south side of the street between Linden and Avalon likewise being without such accommodation.

On motion the matter was referred to the Director of Public Service.

On motion of Binkley, seconded by Grubb, Council adjourned.
