Report of Estimating Board on N. Freedom Avenue from Walnut to Wayne St.

The Estimating Board on the improvement of North Freedom Avenue, submitted the following report:

Alliance, Ohio, August 18th, 1915.

To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

We, the undersigned, having been by Resolution No. 1975 duly directed to prepare an estimated assessment of the cost and expense of paving, etc., N. Freedom Avenue from N. Walnut to Wayne Street as shown by assessment Report No. herewith submits and reports the foregoing assessment for that purpose.

Said assessment, the amount of which is shown in Column 3 is placed upon all the lots and parcels of land specially benefited by said improvement, as described in section _____ of Resolution _____ and is hereby apportioned among the several lots and lands assessed in the proportion that the special benefit to each lot or parcel of land benefited bears to the whole special benefit conferred thereon by the improvement, not thirty three and one third (33-1/3 per cent) of the actual value thereof, after the making of said improvement. The several amounts set forth in Column 1, show the actual value of the land after the improvement is made. The amounts set forth in the report show the special benefit conferred by the improvement and the relative proportion thereof, upon the several lots and parcels of lands assessed.
