Mr. F. W. Watkins, Superintendent of the New York Central Railroad, addressed Council on behalf of an ordinance to prevent trespassing on Railroad property.

Mr. J. J. Robertson addressed Council relative to the construction of a sewer from the New York Central R.R. tracks to the north line of the John Wilson property. Mr. Robertson stated that the sewer would especially benefit the property and proposed paying half the cost of the improvement, the improvement to carry with it the vacation of a portion of an alley embraced within the territory to be improved. An estimate of the cost fixed it at about \$1700.00.

On motion of Knowles, seconded by Cathon, the Solicitor was instructed to draft an ordinance authorizing the construction of this sewer, and providing for the necessary funds.

The Committee on Buildings, to whom was referred the request of the Chamber of Commerce for quarters in the City Hall, submitted the following report:

To the Honorable Council.

Gentlemen: - The Committee to whom this communication was referred, after careful consideration do submit the following report. We would recommend that the Chamber of Commerce of Alliance be granted the use of the Council Chamber in the new City Hall when not in use by the City and not to exceed more than two meetings a month. We further recommend the two rooms on the same floor in the south west side of the building be leased to the Chamber of Commerce for office rooms at Four Hundred Dollars per year (\$400.00); the Chamber of Commerce to furnish their own light, telephones and furniture; the City to furnish heat and water, for a period of three years.
