

An Ordinance to provide for the issuing of the Bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness which from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity:

Sec I Be it ordained and enacted by the council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of extending the time of payment of so much of its existing indebtedness now due and soon to become due as said city is unable from its limits of taxation to pay at maturity there be issued the bonds of said City in the sum of Thirty five Thousand Dollars (\$35,000⁰⁰) as hereinafter provided

Sec II That said Bonds shall be in denominations of Thirty five Bonds of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000⁰⁰) each and shall be numbered consecutively from 889 to 923 inclusive and shall bear date of March 5th 1892 and shall become due and payable March 5th 1902. Said Bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semi-annually on the 5th day of March and September of each year and the several installments of interest shall be evidenced by Coupons attached to said Bonds and both principal and interest shall be payable as they severally become due at the office of the city treasurer of Alliance Ohio. Said Bonds shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued under and in pursuance of this Ordinance and shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk of said City under the Corporate Seal of said City

Sec III That the Mayor and Clerk of said City are hereby authorized and directed as soon as practicable to prepare and execute said Bonds and the proceeds thereof when they shall have been disposed of shall be used and applied under the directions of the Council for the sole purpose of paying off and removing and extending said matured and maturing indebtedness of said City and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec IV

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

An Ordinance to issue a Bond of the City of Alliance Ohio in anticipation of the collection of an assessment made on the 14th day of September 1891.

Sec I Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that to pay the cost and expense remaining due for the improvement of West Main Street between Union avenue and the west corporate line and in anticipation of the collection of an assessment made therefor on the 14th day of September 1891. The Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to issue one Bond of the city for the sum of Nine hundred dollars (\$900⁰⁰) payable at the city treasurers office five years from the 13th day of February 1892 with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semiannually. Said bond shall be advertised and sold for not less than its par value and the proceeds thereof shall be applied to the payment of the cost and expense of said improvement and to no other purpose whatsoever and for the payment of said Bond when the same shall become due. The revenue and faith of the city are hereby pledged. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage and legal publication.

An Ordinance to prohibit connecting with a sewer therein described

Sec I = Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the city of Alliance Ohio that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to connect any drain or pipe with the sewer in said city running east from Freedom Street along the south side of the Pittsburgh, Ft. Wayne & Chicago Railway Company's right of way unless such person or persons shall first get a permit therefor from the Council of said city

Sec II = Any person or persons owning land or other real property adjacent to said sewer and desiring to connect therewith any drain or pipe shall apply to the Council for permission to do so and on the payment of the sum of \$15⁰⁰ by such person or persons for each connection to be made said Council shall grant permission to make connection at places provided therefor

Sec III = Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance or connection thereof shall be fined not more than \$50⁰⁰ and not less than \$25⁰⁰

Sec IV This Ordinance shall not apply to any person who has subscribed and paid for the building of said sewer.

An Ordinance to assess a special tax on the real estate bounding on South Liberty Street from Summit Street to the South side of Milner Street and to issue bonds in anticipation of the collection of such assessment

Sec I. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that there be levied and assessed on each front foot of the several lots of land bounding and abutting on South Liberty Street from Summit Street South to the South side of Milner Street the sums hereinafter named for each and every year as specified to wit:

to provide a fund to pay the cost and expense of improving said South Liberty Street between the points aforesaid together with the interest on the bonds issued according to the estimate of the engineer.

Sec II. That the owners of the several lots of land upon each front foot of which the sums aforesaid are assessed shall pay the amounts by them severally due in that behalf to the City Clerk on or before the 18th day of May in each of the said several years and in default of such payment the said City Clerk shall forthwith certify all such unpaid assessments to the County Auditor to be by him placed on the tax duplicate and collected with interest and penalty according to law

Sec III That to provide a fund to pay the immediate cost and expenses of said improvement The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to issue the bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio in the sum

of five thousand four hundred and twenty dollars \$5420⁰⁰ in ten distinct series of five hundred and forty two dollars (\$542⁰⁰) each payable at the city treasurer's office in one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine and ten years from the 21st day of May 1892, with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semi-annually. Said bonds shall be designated "South Liberty Street Improvement bonds" shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the clerk and be advertised and sold for not less than their par value, and the proceeds thereof shall be applied to the payment of the cost and expenses of said improvement and to no other purpose whatsoever and for the payment of said bonds as they become due. The revenue and faith of said city are thereby pledged. Provided that if before the sale of said bonds any of the property owners shall pay the full amount of their annual installments in cash less the interest included therein, the amount so paid in cash shall be applied to the payment of the cost and expenses of said improvement and the amount of the bonds to be issued shall be reduced by deducting the amount so paid in cash from the first series or succeeding series in their order and the bonds issued shall be to provide a fund for the unpaid remainder.

Sec. IV. That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the City treasury to the credit of the South Liberty Street improvement fund, and the said annual assessments and all portions thereof shall be paid into the sinking fund when collected and shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec V. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force in ten days after its passage and legal publication

An Ordinance to prohibit certain nuisances therein described

Sec I Be it Ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to throw, place or deposit or permit to be thrown placed or deposited in any manner whatever any dirt, paper, filth, sweepings, ashes, shavings, filthy water, offal, straw, wood, stones, brick, Earth of any kind, manure, refuse, waste water, or rubbish of any kind whatever, upon the ground of the P. F. W & C. R. R. between Freedom Avenue and the C & P. R. R. crossing within the limits of said City.

Sec II That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drain or permit to be drained any water, filthy or otherwise upon the grounds described in Section one of this Ordinance

Sec III Any person or persons Violating the provisions of this Ordinance, on conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$50⁰⁰ and not less than \$25⁰⁰.

Sec. IV This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force in ten days after its passage and due publication

An Ordinance to fix the bond and salary and prescribe the duties of the City Street Commissioner and to repeal an Ordinance therein named.

Sec I Be it Ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that the City Street Commissioner shall enter into a bond in the sum of one thousand dollars for the faithful performance of his duties as Street Commissioner and shall receive the sum of twenty cents per hour for his official services and shall perform such labor as the Statutes provide and the City Council may direct

Sec II That the City Street Commissioner shall superintend the repairing and cleaning of the streets, alleys, bridges, culverts and cross-walks of the City under the supervision of the City Council or its appropriate committees and perform such other duties as the Council may from time to time by resolution or Ordinance direct.

Sec III That the City Street Commissioner shall not be directly nor indirectly interested in any work or contract of said City under his charge or the charge of the City Council nor shall he be allowed any fees or perquisites whatever other than his official salary. nor shall he own or have any interest directly or indirectly in any team, horses, wagons, carts, tools or implements used or employed in any work for the City. except that when authorized by resolution of the City Council he may be allowed to use one team and such tools and implements as may be required in the use of such team.

Sec IV. That the City Street Commissioner shall attend all the meetings of the Council and shall at the first meeting of said Council in each month present in writing a report of the work performed during the preceding month under his direction, stating the places at which work was done, the nature of the work

and the total number of men, horses, wagons, carts etc. employed at each place and for what length of time.

Sec V That it shall be the duty of the City Street Commissioner to take a complete inventory of all the city property in his charge the last week in December in each year and also at the expiration of his term of office and report the same together with a summary of his operations and business for the year to the City Council

Sec VI That an Ordinance entitled an Ordinance ~~and~~ creating the office and fixing his compensation passed March 24. 1885. so far as it refers to the Street Commissioner is hereby repealed.

Sec VII This Ordinance shall be in force in ten days after its passage and due publication

An Ordinance to levy a special tax of one mill in addition to all other taxes ^{levied} for municipal purposes for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the bonds issued in pursuance of the special authority herein set forth "

Whereas. The general assembly of the state of Ohio did by an act entitled "an act to authorize the city of Alliance Ohio to borrow money and issue bonds therefor to pay the outstanding indebtedness of said city" passed Feb 12. 1889 authorize the Council of said City of Alliance Ohio to borrow money and issue bonds in any sum not exceeding \$15000.00 and to levy a tax on all the taxable property in said city not exceeding one mill on each dollar in any one year for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon and

Whereas In pursuance of said Authority the Council of the said City of Alliance Ohio did on March 18. 1889 authorize the issue of bonds in the sum of \$14000.00 in accordance with the provisions of said act of the general assembly and Whereas said bonds have been issued in accordance with the terms of said authority: Now Therefore

Sec 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due a tax is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said city except the sixth Ward (formerly Mt Union) of one mill on each and every dollar for the year 1892 in addition to the taxes now authorized by law which levy The Clerk of said City is hereby instructed to certify to the Auditor of Stark County to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes.

An Ordinance to amend the grade on Ely Street.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio That an Ordinance establishing a grade on Ely Street - passed August 27 1879 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Sec I - Beginning at the west line of the Corporation at an elevation of ninety six and eighty six hundredths (96.86) feet thence east nine hundred and seventy one and one half (97 1/2) feet to the west-curb of Lincoln Avenue to an elevation of ninety and twelve hundredths (90.12) feet. Thence east three hundred and six (306) feet to the west curb of Garfield Avenue to an elevation of Eighty eight and seven hundredths (88.07) feet. Thence east thirty four (34) feet to the east-curb of Garfield Avenue to an elevation of Eighty seven and eighty four hundredths (87.84) feet. That the tax heretofore levied for street and sanitary purposes and not yet collected shall when paid into the city treasury be applied to the payment of said note and the interest thereon when due and to no other purpose until the same
