Said assessment, the amount of which is shown in Column \_\_\_\_\_, is placed upon all the lots and parcels of land specially benefitted by said improvement, as described in Section 3 of Resolution 1992, and is apportioned among the several lots or parcels of land assessed in the proportion that the special benefit to each lot or parcel of land benefitted bears to the whole special benefit conferred by the improvement, and does not exceed, upon any lot or parcel of land assessed, the special benefit conferred thereon by the improvement, nor thirty-three and one-third per cent (33 1/3) of the actual value thereof, after the making of said improvement. The several amounts set forth in Column \_\_\_\_\_, show the actual value of the land after the improvement is made. The amounts set forth in column \_\_\_\_\_, show the special benefit conferred by the improvement and the relative proportion thereof, upon the several lots and parcels of land assessed.




