

Monday - Nov. 22, 1915.

Council met in adjourned session with President Reeves in the chair.

The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Barnard, Binkley, Cathon, Grubb, Heidman, Knowles, Ryan. Present 7, Absent 0.

Communication from Trustees of Sinking Fund.

A communication from the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, recommending the increase of salary to the amount of \$300.00 per year per annum, for their Secretary; was read.

Referred to the Finance Committee.

City Band for dedication of City Hall.

City Solicitor Morris stated that Manager Ed. Shultz of the Alliance City Band, through the City Solicitor made a proposition that the band be given a contract for music at the dedication of the new City Hall.

Barnard moved, seconded by Grubb, that it be the sense of Council, that if there is money in the fund, Council hire the City Band for the dedication exercises. Which motion was agreed to.

J.Y. Williams regarding damages to property.

Mr. John Y. Williams addressed Council regarding alleged damages to his property by the excavations made at the North Arch Avenue Subway, and stated that he is willing and anxious to have the matter settled by arbitration rather than go into Court.

On motion of Knowles, seconded by Heidman, the statements made by Mr. Williams were referred to the City Solicitor.

J.J. Robertson, relating to water course.

Mr. J. J. Robertson addressed Council relative to the water course through his property, stating that he had made three propositions to the City and stating that he had no intentions of starting a coal yard as reported, and other remarks relating thereto.

Engineer Pratt of Cleveland addressed Council and presented the following proposition regarding his compensation for drawing plans and specifications for the additions and remodeling of the Sewage Disposal Plant.

Proposition presented by R.W. Pratt, regarding Sewage Disposal Plant.

To the City Council, Alliance, Ohio.

gentlemen:- I herewith propose to prepare full detail plans and specifications, satisfactory to the State Board of Health, for making such additions and repairs to your existing sewage treatment plant as may be mutually deemed necessary. I also propose to superintend the construction of all work necessary to make such additions and repairs; and to furnish a competent resident engineer and necessary assistants.

My charge for the above service and for furnishing the engineer and assistants would be based on approximately 6% of \$40,000.00, and would be as follows:

\$1200.00 for plans and specifications; one-half payable upon the acceptance of said plans and specifications by Council and the balance upon the approval of same by the State Board of Health.

For supervising construction, --- \$350.00 per month. It is believed that the work should be completed within three months, with good weather; and it is my intention to so draw the specifications that a forfeiture will be made by the contractor, sufficient to cover engineering expenses, if the work is not completed within the time agreed to by the contractor.
