Some members of the City Board of Health, which was asked to meet with the Council, were present.

Discussion of garbage question.

Mayor Westover stated that the reason for calling this meeting was to consider the garbage question. He stated that the Sanitary Service Company had violated the contract and had failed to pay the One Hundred Dollars to the City as required by the contract. Also, that the company had failed to provide suitable wagons and coverings for same and had failed to bury garbage taken to the dumping ground.

Grubb asked the Board of Health why the contract of the Sanitary Garbage Company had not been enforced. Discussion arose on the question and continued for some time.

The copy of the contract was read to Council.

Unsanitary condition at viaduct.

Penick reported that an unsanitary condition existed at the north end of the viaduct on Patterson Street, and needed immediate attention. Referred to the Board of Health.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by Stanley, Council adjourned.
