5. Brief Statement of History and Significance

This house is part of the Government Addition that includes houses along Liberty, Grace, Waugh and Morgan st. These houses were War Emergency Construction Project Homes built for soldiers returning home from World War I. This particular house was built of special larger sized hollow bricks made locally and with unique color and featured arches above it's windows and a small covered front porch. It is one of the few remaining, unaltered by additions, examples of one of these types of homes.
