

North Webb Avenue Community Garden

426 North Webb, 400 block section of North Webb Avenue, Alliance.



The North Webb Avenue community garden is located in a food desert area of Alliance. The garden consists of 22 plots, each 5' x 10' that gardeners can rent for the season. Gardeners that sign up for the program are responsible for planting, maintaining, harvesting, and fall clean-up of their plot(s). All gardeners are asked to follow established North Webb Community Garden Guidelines.

A small shed exists for storage of tools and garden supplies, and a picnic table is available for families to share. Water is supplied through rain barrels on site, and a private family water spigot. A compost barrel and a wheelbarrow were donated to the garden at the end of the 2014 season.

A separate herb garden was planted in the northeast corner of the garden consisting of mint, dill, marjoram, cilantro, parsley, sage, onions, several varieties of basil, and chives. In 2014, a pollinator garden was planted in front of the gardens, consisting of flowers and plants that attract beneficial insects and butterflies.

This garden was established in 2013 through a grant from Live Well Stark County and Sisters of Charity Foundation to serve local neighborhood families, and children from the Maple Beach Park summer meals program. Garden plots are assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. If plots have been assigned for the season, candidates may be placed on a waiting list.

The cost of one 5' x 10' plot is \$12 per growing season.
